

Report on New Dimension Braford Sale held at Jimbour Station on 25th August 2007

A large crowd attended the 3rd Annual New Dimension Bull & Female sale at historic Jimbour Station on Saturday 25th August to see 12 Commercial Charolais Bulls – account Jimbour Station, and 23 Braford Bulls, 26 Registered and 19 Commercial Braford Females offered for sale.

Top Price Charolais Bull was Lot 11 – this 22 month old bull weighed 745kg with an EMA of 120 sq cm and was purchased by BL & JN Olsson, Kingaroy.

On two occasions Braford Bulls sold for a Top Price of \$9000. Lot 13 – 21 month old Rarcamba Forrester, with an EMA of 117 sq cm offered by Scott & Veronica Skerman – “Rarcamba” – Wandoan and purchased by Brian and Trinket Anderson, “Glenovan”, Theodore. Lot 25 – 21 month old Carinya Ivan with an EMA of 125 sq cm offered by John & Jackie Amor – “Carinya”- Dulacca and purchased by repeat buyer at the New Dimension Sale, Charles Green , Tigrigie Cattle Co, Taroom.

Top Priced Registered Braford Female was Lot 42 – Rarcamba Gina offered by Scott & Veronica Skerman – “Rarcamba “ stud at Wandoan and purchased by – Lindsay & Lenore Ruhle, “Linlora” Braford stud Allora for \$2000. This is the second year that Lindsay and Lenore have purchased the top priced female at the New Dimension Sale.

Top Priced Pen of Commercial Braford Heifers were offered by the Donovan Family, “Ashby” stud Jimbour and sold to Craig & Kathy Knauth, Jondaryan , who purchased this pen of 3 females for \$1600 each.
