

2007 Ascot Neimen Sale Report

OP is a good drop of Rum

The Ascot Neimen Sale opened with enthusiasm when Ascot OP, by the sire Ascot Rum, was offered as Lot 1. He weighed in at 1032 kg, an IMF of 3.5, an EMA of 140 and first time buyers, Brian and Trinket Anderson from “Glenovan” Theodore battled with a phone bidder, Doug Barnett from “Baroma Downs” Croppa Creek, to purchase OP for \$20,000. Brian was impressed with the outlook and figures of OP as he was with Lot 3 Ascot Levi, by Strathgyle Wrangler, who he also bought for \$6,000. Brian is the son of Stewart and Pam Anderson from “Devil’s Nest” Theodore and have been in the braford breed since the early 70’s.

Owners and operators of the studs, Graham Jill and Dan Galloway were pleased with the day’s results. The average price of the registered bulls was \$6,900 and their EMA measured 126. The whole sale average was \$4,013 and the EMA 117 and the sale clearance was 95%. Other registered bulls went to B & K McLachlan from Ubobo, the McNamara family from Bell, the Weller families from Wooroolin, R & D Kenny from Gayndah, R & S Hay from Taroom, “Early Storms” from Rolleston and first time buyers “Callistem Cattle Co” from Springsure.

Wybalena Past Co representing the Whiteman family, put a great floor in the sale and ended up with a draft of 5 bulls. As did Charles Green, who bought 3 bulls to average \$3000. Other new names in the buyer’s list were A & V Bambling from Gayndah, RL Williams from Taroom, Donovan family from Jimbour and B& D Stretton from Beaudesert.

Other repeat buyers of the day were MJ Tilley from Beaudesert, L & J Muller from Rolleston, B & C Anderson from Clermont, J & D Graving, E Graving, the Wyatte family all from Biloela, Rosebank Grazing from Springsure and also family support from B & A Galloway, Blackwater.

With an overcast wet weather day beginning the mud did not stop the 120 crowd who attended and those that stopped on enjoyed the sale's success at a social evening at the Banana Pub.
